The Rainbow Chorale of Delaware is an inclusive, non-profit community chorus that provides LGBTQ+ individuals, with their friends and allies, the opportunity to perform high-quality choral music in an affirming environment that serves as a positive force for change. In addition, the Rainbow Chorale supports other institutions and individuals who serve that community.

Love of music is common to everyone. When we sing, we hope to impart the ideals, hopes, dreams, and aspirations of our community. Our goal is that with our listening audience we will strike a chord of commonality, and bridge the differences of our life experiences.

ABOUT JOYFUL NOISE DELAWARE

Joyful Noise Delaware (JN DE) was founded in 2009 by Rob Kennan as an offshoot of the original Joyful Noise Chorus in New Jersey (JN NJ). Conceived by Dr. Allison Fromm in honor of her sister Beth, a woman with disabilities who loves to sing, JN NJ began in 2000 and has been going strong ever since. JN DE has partnered with JN NJ and sung at a number of American Choral Director's Association conventions (including ones hosted in Chicago, Hartford, and Providence), at higher learning institutions like Harvard, Yale, Temple and Lehigh universities, for various sporting events like the 76ers and Phillies, at an invited audition for America's Got Talent, and more. With 26 songs commissioned and or written specifically for JN by composers from around the world, the groups continue to inspire audiences of a dozen to well over a thousand. ARTISTIC DIRECTOR



The Rainbow Chorale of Delaware is delighted to have Anthony M. Condoluci-Smith (he/him/his) as Artistic Director. He graduated with honors from the California University of Pennsylvania with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Music and Dance and a minor in Business. There, he performed in and directed a number of vocal and instrumental ensembles and musical theatre performances. He also taught

American Sign Language interpreting to a youth choir at a local camp.

Mr. Condoluci-Smith obtained his Master of Business Administration with a major in Strategic Leadership from the University of Delaware and a Certificate of Human Resource Management from Villanova University. While at the University of Delaware, he studied Choral Literature and Choral Conducting with Dr. Paul D. Head. He has served as the Business Manager at The Music School of Delaware, the Director of Operations at AIDS Delaware, and is currently the Director of People and Culture at Scoir, a technology company in West Chester.

Since relocating to Delaware in 2009, he has performed in several local community ensembles. He served as Director of Music at Christ United Methodist Church (Roselle), the Upper Chesapeake Community Band, and the Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Newark. He has also made guest appearances with the Joe Trainor Trio, Opus One Vocal Arts, Wellspring Ministries, and played Curtis in "Sister Act" at The Everett Theatre in Middletown.

Mr. Condoluci-Smith is an alumnus of The Rainbow Chorale of Delaware. As a singing member, he served on the Board of Directors as the Vice President, Secretary, and Co-Chair of the Artistic Committee. He was the Assistant Artistic Director for the 2016-2017 season, has presented choral workshops, was a soloist and member of PRISM, and has accompanied the Chorale on flute, oboe, and piano. He and his husband, Daniel, reside in Middletown with their Dachshund, Tucker, and Orange Tabby, Memphis.

Rob Kennan, Director of Joyful Noise Delaware, is active as a director, pianist, organist, private instructor, singer, hornist, and composer/arranger in the northern Delaware area. He is the Director of Music and Organist at Newark United Methodist Church, and currently works with the University of Delaware, West Chester University, the Brandywine and Red Clay school districts, Delaware ChoralArts, and

CoroAllegro. A founding member of former male a cappella quintet Qvinctus, he was previously Director of the Northern Delaware Oratorio Society. Earlier engagements include the Wilmington Children's Chorus, Opus One, and Wilmington Handbell Ensemble.

Rob has played horn locally with Newark Symphony, Wilmington Community Orchestra, Diamond State Concert Band, and Brandywine Pops Orchestra, previously playing with a number of professional organizations such as the Dallas Brass.

Rob holds his bachelor's degree from Shenandoah University and a master's from the University of North Texas. He has been a musician and educator in many states and a member of various boards, including the Music Educators National Conference, American Choral Directors Association, American Guild of Organists, Handbell Musicians of America, Joyful Noise, Wilmington Handbell Ensemble, and Valley Educational Center for Creative Arts.
