## NOTES FROM THE PODIUM

Welcome and thank you for joining us for our "Everything Old Is New Again" concert! As a newcomer to this wonderful organization, I found myself feeling more and more connected with this concert theme. I have been singing in or directing choirs for many years, but this season with the Rainbow Chorale of Delaware has made the experience feel new again. They have welcomed me whole-heartedly and trusted me with their voices. There is an energy, positivity, and warmth to this group and I am grateful to be among them. I hope this feeling extends to you as you listen today.

Today's concert will present a few pairings of traditional carols and familiar tunes with reinterpretations of these pieces. These pairings will be interspersed with a few stand alone selections. Our concert begins with *O Magnum Mysterium* (Victoria, 1572) as a stand alone selection. This renaissance motet presents the text of the "great mystery" of the birth of Jesus Christ in a manger. This ancient sacred text continues to provide inspiration for composers to this day. Another of our other stand alone pieces includes the tenor and bass feature of *Heat Miser/Snow Miser* (Laws & Bass, 1974) from the TV film "The Year Without A Santa Claus". This piece will feature two soloists and a lot of attitude. The sopranos and altos have their own feature *The Caffeine Overload Polka* (Barnes, 2002). Here you will hear a relatable tale of our caffeinated existence. Also included with our stand alone pieces are four selections that tenderly express the beauty of the season. *Glow* (Whitacre, 2013), *Nun Gimel Hei Shin* (Shatin, 1999), *This Christmastide* (Fraser, 1988), and *In The Bleak Midwinter* (Darke, 1993), which all illustrate the majesty, excitement, and the mystery of the season.

Our first reinterpretation comes from *The "Shouldn't Be" Carols* (Barnes, 2012). Within this medley we have familiar tunes with altered lyrics. This piece details the frustrations and antics of the holiday season. One of the tunes included in this medley is the same as another of our selections, *We Three Kings* (Meader, 2004). Some of our other paired selections include *Hark! The Herald Angels Sing* (Mendelssohn, 1840) with *Coming Out on Christmas* (Johnson, 1995) and *White Christmas* (Berlin, 1942) with *Pink Christmas* (Weirick, 2015).

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Sarah Jane Gober, our collaborative pianist, for her incredible work and support. I would also like to thank the RCD Board and membership for putting their faith in me this year. RCD would like to thank the Presbyterian Church of the Covenant for their support and allowing us to use their facilities for our rehearsals as well as Skyline United Methodist Church for hosting our concerts this weekend. As we gather together for this old tradition of a holiday concert, I hope you find something new to be excited about. It is my hope that this concert leaves you rejuvenated for the holiday season. It was a great pleasure preparing these selections for you and getting to know this group. We wish you a happy, safe, and fulfilling holiday season. As always, RCD thanks you for your support!




